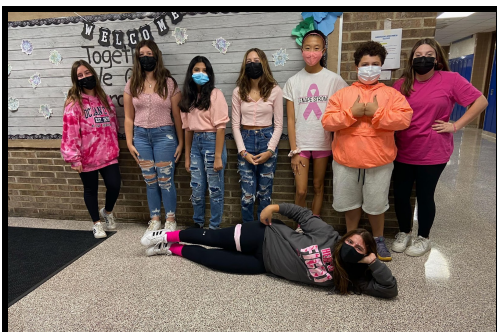

Here are some ways you can save your or anyone else's life with these fire safety tips!

- Make sure your house fire alarm has batteries in them. Your fire alarm could be not charged and you would never know there's a fire without it, Therefore you should always make sure you have batteries in your house fire alarm so you can know when to evacuate and/or put the fire out!
- Always have a fire extinguisher. Fire extinguishers can save lives and property you own by putting out a fire or making it smaller until the fire department arrives. A fire extinguisher can possibly save your life!
- Know what to do in case there's a fire. When you know what to do, it's more likely you can survive. You can practice with friends and/or family members on escape plans. You can make ways to go outdoors, stop, drop

and roll and stay low on the ground. If a fire extinguisher is around and fire isn't around, you can grab it and spray it at the base of the fire to decrease it a bit until The fire department arrives at your location.

- And lastly, Knowing the 3 P's. The 3 P's are prevent, plan and practice. This means to prevent any terrible fire hazards that are possible or will make you in an unsafe environment. October Book & Author Review:

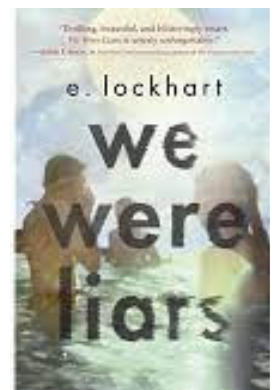
We Were Liars by E. Lockhart

Cadence spends time with her cousins, or the Liars, Mirren, Johnny, and Gat, her Aunt Carrie's boyfriend's son. Ever since Gat started visiting the island during the summers, Cadence formed a close friendship with him and she finds herself falling deeply in love. One night, Cadence goes to the beach to swim late at night and swam out far, and she thinks she hit her head.

This heavily affects Cadence, and for the next six weeks, she blacks out, vomits, and loses an unhealthy amount of weight. But the sickness is much

Volume 2: Horror Movies

Saw. Scream. The Conjuring. Halloween. Annabelle.

For some, it's a Saturday night full of popcorn and sweets. For others, it's a night of excruciating terror. But why is this? Why can some sit through a horror movie without batting an eye, and others have to hide under

a blanket just to get through it? Well, with Halloween approaching, it seems like a good time to take a further look into this interesting phenomenon.

It's clear that horror movies are well-loved. Take *It Chapter One*-the 2017 adaptation of Stephen King's novel-for example. This movie grossed a shocking 700 million dollars in the box office worldwide. Or the swarms of people who flocked to theatres in 2017 to watch a demonic doll terrorize a young orphan. The appeal of the gross and gory movies is undeniable.

A study was conducted on our school's students asking the question, *Do you like horror movies? If so, why?* Their answers might be shocking. A staggering 64% of students reported liking horror movies. With that, their *why* explanations included: "I like the thrill and the action. I also like dumb decisions." "Yes, I like to be scared." "Yes, the characters are always hot." "Yes, especially demon ones. They always have cool storylines, and I like trying to figure them out."

Though we have the answers of how many children enjoy horror movies, the bigger question is why? A study from October 2020, published by the Journal of Media Psychology explains the deeper psychological roots of enjoying a horror movie. The study concluded that people watch horror movies for three main reasons: tension, relevance, and unrealism. Along with that many reported finding horror movies oddly comforting.

Krista Jordan, Ph.D., a clinical psychologist explains our brain's fight-or-flight response to these movies. "The brain doesn't always distinguish between fantasy and reality completely effectively. For example, get someone to describe biting into a lemon, and

if the person is really good at describing it, your salivary glands will activate." This same logic applies to watching thrilling movies. By watching your favorite character relentlessly fight for their life, you too experience a similar adrenaline rush. Not only that but your brain is flooded with "feel good" hormones like dopamine and endorphins.

If we turn the tables and look at the other end of the spectrum, you will find some individuals -kids and adults alike- who find horror movies appalling. Responses from this end of the spectrum were as follows: "No, they make me uncomfy." "I don't like scary things" "They make me too anxious" "People always make too many stupid decisions" "I legitimately feel like I'm gonna throw up."

Maybe those of us who enjoy horror movies could be considered weird or twisted for enjoying watching such gore, but at least now you know a little bit more about what goes on inside of your brain to trigger that response. And though I can't offer my support to those of you who will be forced to sit through a horror movie with your friends, I can still wish you a happy Halloween.

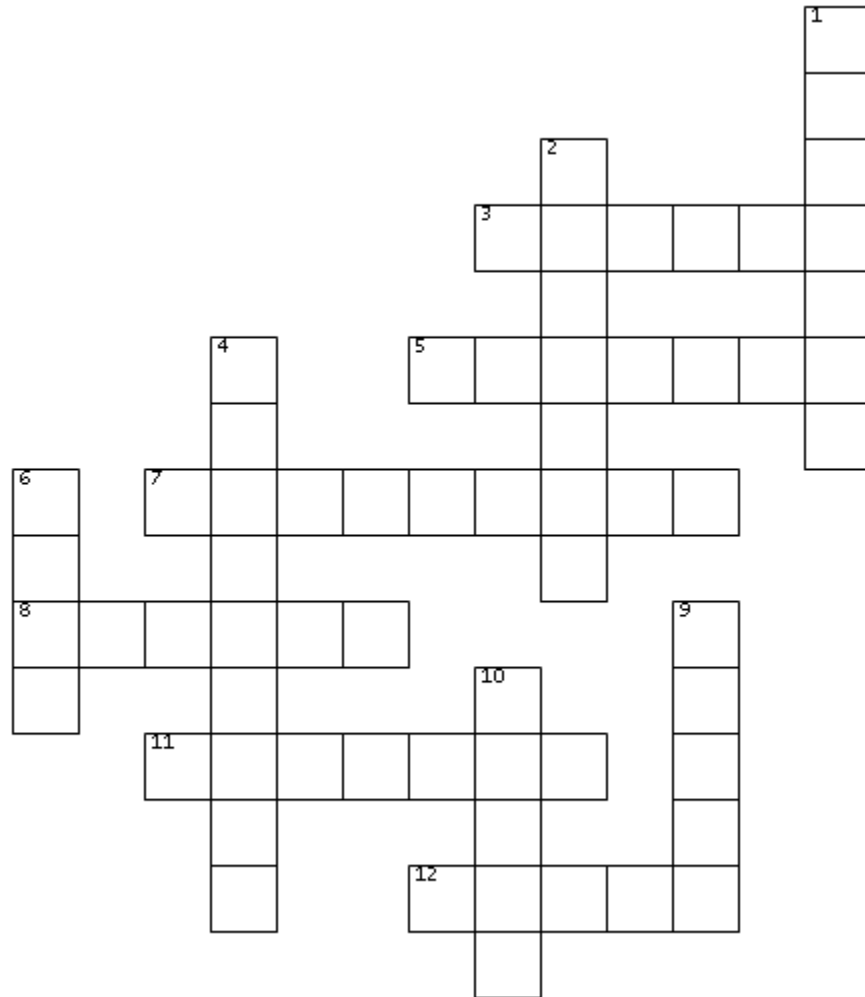
