Eclipse 2024 Rose N.

On April 8th, parts of the United States experienced something that some of us may never see again. 15 of the states were in the path of the solar eclipse, stretching all the way from Maine to Texas. The eclipse began at 2:10 pm, reached its peak at 3:24 pm, and ended at 4:35 pm. While New Jersey only was able to view a partial eclipse, the sun-show was a one-in-a-lifetime experience.

A solar eclipse occurs when the moon is in its 'new moon' phase. The moon's orbit has a slight tilt to Earth's orbit around the sun. When the sun, moon and Earth align, the sun is blocked out by the moon. The moon then casts a shadow onto the Earth, which is why it appears darker when a solar eclipse is happening. If you're located in the darker part of the shadow, you're in the umbra, and you'll be able to see a full eclipse. This is when the sun is completely covered by the moon so the sun is no longer visible. If you're in the light outer part, which is called the penumbra, you'll see a partial eclipse. New Jersey was in the light outer shadow, allowing us to only see a partial eclipse.

Viewing eclipses with your bare eyes is extremely dangerous because the sun's very bright rays will burn cells in your retina, located at the back of your eyes. You won't know it's happening though, because your retinas have no pain receptors so you wouldn't be able to feel it burning. That's why you should wear eclipse glasses, which protect your eyes from the sun because of the thick layers of polyester film coated in aluminum. This makes the glasses almost 100,000 times darker than regular sunglasses.

Harrington provided each student with eclipse glasses so students would be able to view the eclipse safely. These glasses were from the assistant superintendent's office, who purchased them for the students. The next solar eclipse that is in the United States will be in 2044, which is 20 years. Can you believe that at that time, most of us will be 33 or 34?

I asked an 8th-grade science teacher, Mr. Dempster, a few questions regarding the eclipse. This is the information he shared with me.

What happens during a solar eclipse?

"During a solar eclipse, the moon's positioned in its orbit such that it is between the Sun and the Earth and blocks the sun's light. Because the moon orbits the Earth at an angle, it does not happen every time it is between the Sun and Earth making it quite rare."

What made this solar eclipse special?

"When a solar eclipse occurs, the moon casts a relatively small shadow on the Earth causing it to only be seen fully from a small part of the planet. Most of Earth's surface is ocean, so most of the time when the moon casts a shadow, it will land there. This year, like in 2017, a total solar eclipse was visible in the United States."

What did you think of this eclipse?


"New Jersey was not able to enjoy the full spectacle unfortunately, as the path of totality (where the shadow of the moon will fall as it goes across our sky) went from Maine southwest through Texas leaving us with only about 93% coverage. We also had a good amount of clouds which didn't help with the viewing. It was pretty cool to see the Sun reduced to a thin sliver of a crescent through the eclipse glasses, but we did miss out on the full experience of being in the path of totality."

How did the eclipse in New Jersey compare to other parts of the country?

"As previously mentioned, we missed out on the full experience of 100% coverage. Even at 99.6% coverage, some friends of mine in Cincinnati, OH got to see the Sun almost entirely covered but it did not feel like it did in places with total coverage. In places where the Sun was completely blocked by the moon, only the Sun's corona could be seen spilling over the outside of the moon. The rest of the sky turned dark and in some places, the stars came out because the Sun was no longer lighting up the sky."

An earthquake in New Jersey occurred on April 5th, originating in Tewksbury, NJ at 10:20 A.M, with a magnitude of 4.8. There were 28 reported aftershocks, according to the United States Geological Survey. The strongest was a 3.8 magnitude in Gladstone, NJ, the same day but at 5:30 PM. This earthquake was

Philadelphia, and Mount Laurel. Fortunately, it was not very severe and hardly left any damage. Also, it was for a very short period (approximately 10 seconds). This earthquake occurred most likely due to the Ramapo Fault zone, fault lines in the state's northern half. Earthquakes happen due to sudden movements along fault lines, boundaries that separate tectonic plates, which are pieces of the Earth's crust and the uppermost mantle.

For many of our peers and staff, this was the first time they had experienced an earthquake. This is because the last major earthquake in New Jersey happened on November 29, 1783, and was supposedly 5.3 on the Richter scale (magnitude).

Interesting facts

- The strongest earthquake recorded was a magnitude 9.5 earthquake, and it happened on May 22, 1960, in Chile.
- About 50 earthquakes happen every day. However, most of these are so small that they cannot be
- On July 9th, 1958, a magnitude 8 earthquake happened that caused a tsunami that was 1,720 feet tall. For comparison, that is as tall as the World Trade Center in New York City.
- The Ring of Fire is a hot zone for earthquakes.
- Just like Earth has earthquakes, the moon has moonquakes.

AIRLINE HEIST

Search warrants have been put out on 4 men and 2 arrested on charges of being connected to a historical gold heist that occurred at the Toronto Pearson International Airport. On April 17, 2023, a cargo airliner belonging to Air Canada arrived from Zurich, Switzerland. Its cargo? \$22.5 million worth of gold and foreign currency. The cargo was offloaded to a secure storage facility where it was locked away. Law enforcement believes that two workers for Air Canada supplied fake paperwork to 4 others who entered the secure facility using said paperwork. The cargo container containing the valuables was loaded onto a truck driven by a former Air Canada employee. Recently, a Canadian man and his rental vehicle were searched at a traffic stop in Pennsylvania. When a state trooper found illegal firearms in the vehicle, the Canadian, who was in the country illegally, fled on foot. He was quickly caught and discovered to be the driver of the cargo truck that stole the valuable cargo.

According to Eric DeGree in an interview with CNN, "A court-authorized search warrant for the vehicle led to the recovery of those firearms that were allegedly destined to be smuggled into Canada." Mr. DeGree is a special agent for the US Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives. "Over 65 weapons were stopped from being used to commit any number of violent crimes," says Mr. DeGree. Law enforcement agrees that the gold and cash were being used to traffic firearms into Canada. "We believe that they've melted down the gold and the profits they got from the melted gold they used to finance the purchasing of illegal firearms," said Detective Sgt. Mike Mavity of Peel Regional Police, the municipality where the heist occurred. Deputy Police Chief Nick Millinovich stated, "This was the largest gold heist in Canadian history, reportedly, it's the sixth largest worldwide." Law enforcement has only recovered about \$90,000 worth of the gold stolen. The search continues for the gold and cash.

Autism Acceptance/Awareness

We all know that autism is a thing. It's likely that we know someone with Autism. But a lot of the time, it's hard to understand and help. Surprisingly, many websites are not a good source for learning about these things. I think we need to change our views on Autism completely.

Interview (with someone who has autism, and would like to remain anonymous) What injustices or problems do you face?

"My stimming. A lot of people think it's weird. A lot of people judge me for it. Loudness, if I feel there's nowhere to go. Not being able to have accommodations. Especially in school. It makes me not be able to learn properly or learn at all."

Do you face any bullying or are you treated differently because of your autism?

"Yes. Not by people who are aware, but by people who think I'm weird or different and make fun of me for my actions, but not for my autism itself."

Do you think if you told these people you have autism they would treat you better or worse?

"See, I feel like they would probably treat me *differently*, not better or worse. I feel like they would not outwardly make fun of me, but inwardly make fun of me. You know, treat me less human."

What do you think of people who mimic/make fun of certain stereotypes and symptoms of autism? What would you like to say to them?

"See, it's, it's really hard because I don't know what I would say to them. I don't think they know what they're doing, to be honest. Because that's how the first autistic people looked, that's how these people must look. It really hurts people, and it assumes that they're lesser and less capable of being a part of society. It makes me and other autistic people so mad when they use the 'r-word'. Other curse words can be used in a light way. There is absolutely no light way you can use it and it should not exist."

What do you think of websites that try to "fix" autism, or say things that "help" but actually harm people? "They're not helping us. They're helping the caretakers that treat us like problems that need to be fixed and I hate them so much."

Autistic websites, organizations, and sources

There are a lot of websites and organizations for autism. But autistic people say sometimes these organizations can do more harm than good. Some of these organizations see autism as a "puzzling problem", hence the puzzle piece symbol. They force people who are in these groups to mask and stop habits such as stimming. Some groups like this include *Autism Speaks, TACA, Autism One, National Autistic Society, Generational Rescue,* and *Autism Society.* These organizations aren't run by autistic people, nor do autistic people have anything to say in the way they are run. Once, one of these organizations tried to hire an autistic person, and they left because of what horrible things they were doing.

Some good resources for learning how to help and just about autism in general all come from autistic people themselves. The biggest problem, according to them, is that people don't treat them like people like they are either some animal they can poke and use for fun. Some good YouTube channels made by autistic people include Morgan Foley, Paige Layle, Kalyn Partlow, and "I'm autistic, now what"

Autism and mental health

Not a lot of people know how badly autistic people's mental health can be affected by not being diagnosed and forced to mask. Stimming is a way people use to comfort themselves by stimulating their senses, hence the term "stimming". Masking is bad because it forces people to stop their behaviors and change their habits because "it's weird" or "not normal".

I can not stress enough how much Autistic people need to just be treated as normal people, and that's not what a lot of people do. Studies show that around 60% of Autistic children are bullied. A lot of this can include mocking things they can't control and making fun of behaviors they might not notice at all.

There are a lot of myths about Autism that people spread because that's what The Autism stereotype is. For example, Autistic people refuse to engage, have no emotions, etc. I strongly encourage visiting the websites listed at the end of this article to learn more and hear the words directly from Autistic writers rather than me. Just remember, just because a coping strategy works for one autistic person, doesn't mean it'll work for everyone.

Glossary and additional information

Stimming - something that someone with autism does that stimulates their senses. Stopping stimming can affect their health very negatively, but some stimming behaviors can.

Masking - Stopping habits/symptoms/stimming because of bullying them or telling them to stop because it is weird or starting to do something because "normal people" do that.

What are some symptoms of autism? - There are a lot of symptoms for autism. The most common ones are: Not being able to look people in the eyes,


Where can I get tested for autism? - You can get tested at your doctor's office. You can also ask your guidance counselor for help, even though they can't test you directly.

How do I *actually* help someone with autism cope with bullying? - The best thing you can do is make them feel comfortable. Just because you've heard doing one thing may help with some autistic people does not mean it will work for this person.

Ramadan is a Muslim holiday in which Muslims fast during the sunlit hours to draw closer to God and cultivate self-control, gratitude, and compassion for those less fortunate for a month. Muslims fast from pre-dawn to sunset, a fast of between 11-16 hours depending on the time of year for 29-30 days. Muslims welcome Ramadan as an opportunity for self-reflection and spiritual improvement and as a means to grow in moral excellence. Ramadan is also a highly social time as Muslims invite each other to breakfast together and meet for prayers at the mosque.

Breaking the fast with dates or water is the only strictly traditional culinary custom associated with Ramadan. It is interesting to note the suitability of dates for this purpose as they are a concentrated source of energy and easily digestible. Different Muslim-populated countries have a variety of special dishes and desserts for Ramadan.

Ramadan is a special holiday for Muslims. It serves as a reminder of the importance of faith, compassion, and gratitude in people's lives. It is important to be kind and respectful of everyone's cultures and beliefs.




