Kaley's Microwave Fudge



This is a kid-friendly recipe that tastes like it took hours to make!

Ingredients:

- ☐ 4 Tablespoons (or ½ stick) Butter
- 1 cup Semi-Sweet Chocolate Chips
- □ 1 cup Milk Chocolate Chips
- 1 cup Peanut Butter Chips
- 1 1/4 ounce can Sweetened Condensed Milk
- 1 Teaspoon Vanilla Extract

Optional add-ins

- 1 cup Heath Toffee Bits
- 1 cup Chopped Walnuts or Pecans

Instructions:

- 1. Put chocolate chips, butter, and sweetened condensed milk in a large microwave-safe bowl.
- 2. Microwave for 2 minutes.
- 3. Stir everything together as much as you can.
- 4. Microwave for additional 30-second increments until you can stir it completely together. (Maybe 1-2 more minutes).
- 5. Pour chocolate into a 9x9 pan lined with aluminum foil or parchment paper
- 6. Decorate with nuts, toffee bits, or sprinkles if desired.
- 7. Refrigerate until hardened.
- 8. Using the foil or paper liner, lift out of the pan and cut the fudge into 1" squares.

For extra fun: Instead of a square pan, pour the fudge into your favorite cookie cutters. Pop the fudge out after it hardens and enjoy!

Picking up off of what happened in the last article, November edition, we start off when the bastion remnants were raided by Piglins. With many players in the nether dead, the ancient



Winter holidays in different Cultures By: Anika T. Hanukkah

For eight days each November or December, Jews light a special candleholder called a menorah. They do it to remember an ancient miracle in which one day's worth of oil burned for eight days in the temple. During Hanukkah, many Jews also eat special potato pancakes called latkes. They also sing songs and spin a top called a dreidel to win chocolate coins, nuts, or raisins.

Three Kings Day

At the end of the Twelve Days of Christmas comes a day called the Epiphany, or Three Kings Day. This holiday is celebrated as the day the three wise men first saw baby Jesus and brought him gifts. On this day in Spain, many children get their Christmas presents. In Puerto Rico, before children go to sleep on January 5, they leave a box with hay under their beds so the kings will leave good presents. In France, a delicious King cake is baked. Bakers will hide a coin, jewel, or little toy inside.

Kwanzaa

Kwanzaa, which means "First Fruits," is based on ancient African harvest festivals and celebrates ideals such as family life and unity. During this spiritual holiday, celebrated from December 26 to January 1, millions celebrate in special clothes, decorate their homes with fruits and vegetables, and light a candleholder called a kinara.

New Year

To celebrate the Chinese New Year, many children dress in new clothes to celebrate and people carry lanterns and join in a huge parade led by a silk dragon. According to legend, the dragon hibernates most of the year, so people throw firecrackers to keep the dragon awake.

In Ecuador, families dress a straw man in old clothes on December 31. The straw man represents the old year. The family members make a will for the straw man that lists all of their faults. At midnight, they burn the straw man, in hopes that their faults will disappear with him.

In Japan, Omisoka (or New Year's Eve) is the second most important holiday of the year, following New Year's Day, the start of a new beginning. Japanese families gather for a late dinner around 11 PM, and at midnight, many make visits to a shrine or temple.

Those in Hong Kong pray to the gods and ghosts of their ancestors, asking that they will fulfill wishes for the next year. Priests read aloud the names of every living person at the celebration and attach a list of the names to a paper horse and set it on fire.

Christmas

People celebrate this Christian holiday by going to church, giving gifts, and sharing the day with their families. In some parts of Europe, "star singers" go caroling-singing special Christmas songs-as they walk behind a huge star on a pole. The Christmas festivities in Ireland tend to be more religious rather than being about gifts. Christmas celebrations last from Christmas Eve until January 6 (Epiphany). On December 26, known as St. Stephen's Day, an Irish tradition that is known as the Wren Boys Procession takes place. Children go from door to door singing, holding a stick that is topped by a holly bush and a wren. They ask for money for the "starving wren," which goes into their pockets. The Christmas Eve festivities in Ukraine are known as Sviata Vechera, which means "Holy Supper." The celebration begins when the first evening star is sighted in the night sky. In farming communities, the household head brings in a sheaf of wheat.

Sugar On Top Holiday Tree Brownies:

Ingredients-

1 box Brownie Mix 1 tub white vanilla icing green food coloring small round sprinkles small star sprinkles candy canes



Instructions:

- 1. Line an 8"x8" baking pan with aluminum foil and spray with cooking spray.
- 2. Prepare the brownie mix according to the package directions and bake as directed.
- 3. Allow brownies to completely cool, approximately 1.5 hours.
- 4. Remove the brownies from the pan, and cut them into triangles. (Cut in three rows, then cut in alternating diagonals, as in the photo shown above).
- 5. Unwrap the candy canes, and use a sharp knife to gently cut/break the candy canes into 1.5" long pieces.
- 6. Press the sharper end of the candy cane into the bottom of the brownie triangles.
- 7. Spoon out approximately 1/2 of the tub of icing into a bowl.
- 8. Add green food coloring until you're happy with the color.
- 9. Spoon the green icing into a zip lock bag.
- 10. Seal the bag and cut off a small corner of the bag with sharp scissors.
- 11. Starting at the top of the brownie triangles, gently squeeze out the icing in a curvy zigzag as you go down the tree.
- 12. Add your favorite sprinkles and a small star sprinkle at the top.
- 13. Enjoy

<u>Puzzle Piece Snowflake Ornament</u>

1. Get 6 puzzle pieces, around the same shape, and paint them white.

2. Hot glue the bottoms of each piece together to create a snowflake shape (see picture).

3. Make a loop with ribbon or string and glue it to the back to put your ornament up.

Snowman Fake Candle Ornament

1. Get a battery-operated fake candle and draw eyes and a mouth on with a sharpie, using the flame as a nose.

2. Hot glue two mini pom-poms to the sides of the candle.

3. Cut a pipe cleaner long enough to connect the two pom-poms to make earmuffs.

4. Take a piece of ribbon and make a loop to create a scarf. Then hot glue it to the bottom of the candle.

5. Make a loop with ribbon or string and glue it to the back to put your ornament up.



Melted Crayon Glass Ornament

- 1. Get any shape of a clear glass ornament and pull the top off.
- 2. Break different colored crayons into small pieces.
- 3. Put them inside the glass ornament.
- 4. Use a hairdryer to melt the crayons and make sure the colors swirl.
- 5. Let it dry, put the top on, and hang it up.



On our Number 5 spot: Roy Orbison, American Singer-Songwriter from the 1960s.


Number 4: Bleachers, Indie Pop solo act and the stage name for Jack Antonoff, of FUN fame.

Number 2: The Rolling Stones, an incredibly famous Rock band.


And of course, number 1, Bruce Springsteen, Rock and Roll

"Oh," Birb said.


"I'm really confused..." Danger said.
