<u>Memorial Day</u>

On the last Monday of May, a national holiday many know as Memorial Day is recognized. This year, Memorial Day will be on Monday, May 27th. Memorial Day is a day to honor those who have passed away while serving in the United States Armed Forces. Memorial Day was originally called Decoration Day because many people would decorate the graves of those who passed from serving with flowers, wreaths, and flags. The first observation of this holiday was in 1868 to remember the sacrifices made by Civil War soldiers. By 1873, New York had declared Memorial Day a legal holiday, and more states later named it legal and had a greater observation of it. After World War I, the holiday was opened to honor everyone who had died in all of America's wars. In 1971, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act for Memorial Day, which says the federal holiday must annually be on a Monday. Besides Memorial Day, the only other holiday that got past this act is Washington's birthday, the third Monday of February.

On Memorial Day, there are several things you can do. You can honor the soldiers who died by visiting cemeteries. You can also place flowers or American flags on the soldiers' graves. There are usually many ceremonies and parades which sometimes conclude with a Memorial service. At the Arlington National Cemetery, a small flag is placed on each grave every year. The president or vice president always places a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier as well. On Memorial Day, the most simple thing you can do is participate in the National Moment of Remembrance. This is at 3:00 pm local time. To participate in it, pause whatever you're doing and have a moment of silence for one minute to remember those who died for us in military service. Also, on Thursday, May 23rd, there will be a Memorial Day Tribute located at Laurel Acres Park at 6:00 pm.

There are also a few things you should try to avoid doing on Memorial Day. The most important one is don't wish anyone a 'Happy Memorial Day.' Memorial Day honors those who are no longer with us, so it isn't really a 'happy' day. Also, try not to thank anyone for their service, for the same reason as above. Don't forget about this national holiday and its importance. The purpose of Memorial Day is so we can recognize those who died in war for us, so we should remember that of all things.

Today, more than one million men and women are recognized on Memorial Day since the Civil War began in 1861. Memorial Day is a day of commemoration and honoring across the country. Did you know the red poppy is the symbol of remembrance? It originated in 1915 during World War I when Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae's sadness was taken over when he saw poppies blooming all across Europe.


